



Throughout 2018, the Foundation for Endodontics proudly provided funding, resources and opportunities to endodontists in all stages of their careers. Since I stepped into the role as president of the Foundation for Endodontics in April 2018, I have gained a sense of pride and humility toward our revered Foundation and its organic roots.

The Foundation for Endodontics was formerly known as many names, including:

- Endowment & Memorial Foundation of the AAE as it was established in 1966;
- Research & Education Foundation of the AAE which it became in 1989:
- AAE Foundation to which it transitioned in 1995.

Though the name has changed, what's in the name has not! Our mission has always had a stronghold on endodontic research and education, believed to strengthen the science and art of the specialty at its very core. At the same time as the adoption of its nickname, Foundation for Endodontics, in 2015, the Board went through a strategic planning process, in which its mission, vision and values were expanded. Our mission now includes access to care and public awareness. While we are still funding research and education to the same high standard, we firmly believe this expansion tells a more complete story of endodontics as a specialty.

As our organization has grown and developed over the years, endodontists have steadily supported the Foundation. Throughout our organization's growth and development, the AAE's members have steadfastly supported through their time, talent and treasure. Our generous donors are compelled to support the Foundation for a variety of reasons.

Some donors give because it is a personal or familial tradition. Others give because they want to inspire positive growth in one of our focus areas or ensure a strong future for the next generation of endodontists.

Each donor's motivations to support our philanthropic traditions are as unique as the lens through which they view our specialty. 



Root End Resection Surgery

Endodontists are experts in pain management and Dr. Jennifer L. Gibbs is on a mission to keep it that way. Her project seeks to identify risk factors for pain in post-operative patient experiences. Her study, funded by the Foundation for Endodontics in the spring of 2018, is driven by Gibbs' belief in the need for endodontists to have more specific information about what drives post-operative pain.

Pain management is essential to success in endodontics. Many patients' first question before surgery is, "How much will this hurt?" If equipped with knowledge of specific risk factors that contribute to pain, clinicians might be better equipped to identify those patients who will need extra care and intervention in order to have a successful surgical recovery period.

PROJECT: Nanoparticle Guided Dentin
Micro-Tissue Engineering: Characterizing Fluid
Dynamics and Mechanical Characteristics

Dr. Fang-Chi Li has always had deep respect for her chosen field of endodontics. She says her interest in endodontics stems from her wish to utilize engineering principles to surmount practical frustrations and roadblocks faced by clinicians. "Endodontic treatment has long been the treatment of choice to maintain the long-term functional requirements of a natural tooth, but even when the highest standards of clinical procedures are followed, microbial biofilms still persist within the anatomic complexities and uninstrumented portions of the root canal system." Dr. Li's research project seeks to make progress towards developing a minimal invasive treatment strategy with dual objectives of improving the antibacterial efficacy within root canal system and enhancing the mechanical integrity of remaining dentin against vertical root fracture. She hopes doing so will enhance predictability and improve root canal efficiency.

Dr. Li's *in vitro* study will focus on developing a strategy to deliver the nanoparticles efficiently to root canal dentin using a novel activated-microbubble method. The findings will provide an insight of fluid dynamics associated with MB strategy and to determine a way to apply nanoparticles into root canal system practically.

In the fall of 2018, the Foundation for Endodontics funded Dr. Leticia Chaves de Souza's research project. In her study, Dr. Chaves de Souza hopes to provide useful data for clinicians to employ in their daily practice when deciding which endodontic materials to use in the many varied cases they encounter.

The investigation of the properties of endodontic materials is quite important. Dr. Chaves de Souza believes that as endodontists, it is necessary to fully understand the physical-chemical and biological properties of endodontic sealers, so that the best suitable materials may be chosen for each case. After the most appropriate sealer has been chosen, Dr. Chaves de Souza emphasizes that the proper obturation technique be understood for each sealer.

Omid Seyed Dianat, DDS, MS

University of Maryland

PROJECT: The Accuracy and Efficiency of a Dynamic 3D Navigation System for Negotiating Calcified Canals

Dr. Omid Seyed Dianat is a second-year endodontics resident at the University of Maryland. His study, funded by the Foundation in the fall of 2018, examines the accuracy and precision of dynamic navigation in endodontics.

Root canal configuration and morphology creates many challenges in everyday endodontic practice. One such challenge is calcification following restorative procedures and traumatic injuries. Despite breakthroughs in technology, canal localization in calcified canals is still considered to be a time consuming and stress-inducing procedure for clinicians.

The findings of Dr. Dianat's study will provide an understanding of the limitations of the X-Guide 3D navigation technology while gathering information for its clinical applications and future investigations.

Investing in the Future of Endodontics Through Support for Today's Educators

Developing a pool of outstanding educators to train future endodontists and dentists in the art and science of endodontics is an ongoing goal of the Foundation. The success and future growth of the specialty is reliant on the quality education of today's endodontic residents. Through funding opportunities designed to support endodontic educators and postgraduate programs, the Foundation is investing in the development of outstanding academicians who are providing the highest level of education possible to the specialty.

The Foundation's support of endodontic educators and departments takes shape in a variety of opportunities:

Ten-Year Anniversary Grant

Awards qualified academicians who have dedicated 10 years to teaching endodontics full-time.

Full-Time Endodontic Educator Development Grant

Provides flexible funding to educators for continuing education and professional development from a variety of providers.

Endowed Faculty Matching Grant

Assists endodontic departments with their own philanthropic initiatives by offering \$100,000 to complete an eligible campaign to fund a permanent faculty position.

ADEA/AAE Foundation Scholar for the ADEA Leadership Institute

Sponsorship for an endodontic educator to participate in the ADEA Leadership Institute.

Endodontic Educator Fellowship Award

Supports educators who agree to commit a minimum of five years to a full-time academic career in endodontics.

As an assistant professor at the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto, Dr. Shrestha is a fine example of an educator who serves as a strong leader, brings remarkable inspiration to her students and great value to the specialty. The Foundation's Endodontic Educator Fellowship Award is an example of a funding opportunity that ensures highly qualified and dedicated specialists are teaching endodontics to postgraduate residents and dental students. The award supports individuals who are deeply passionate about endodontics and make an incredible impact on the specialty through their work in education. With a vested interest in their students, research and the newest technology in the field, the Foundation for Endodontics' fellows gain well deserved recognition for their motivation and commitment to endodontics. Their value and influence on the specialty goes far beyond the dollars awarded.


...Benefitting Tomorrow

Since the opportunity became available, the Endodontic Educator Fellowship Award has supported 23 educators teaching in programs across the U.S. and Canada, who are charting the path for the future of the specialty, with (\$1.7 million-plus) to offset the financial burden of pursuing a career in academia. Recipients of the award remain committed to education at the highest level and hold positions ranging from pre-doctoral directors, program directors, department chairs and leadership roles in organized dentistry. The Foundation is proud to remain invested in quality endodontic education through other smaller awards that allow educators to stay at the forefront of dentistry through professional development opportunities. The educators benefitting from the funding opportunities available to them from the Foundation are directly impacting the future of endodontics through their work with students. They are laying the foundation on which the next generation of endodontists will build to continue making innovations in the field, expanding the pool of research and growing the specialty. Our educators are the ones igniting the passion that fuels the promising future of endodontics.




Fostering a Global Community

Since its establishment in 2016, The Foundation for Endodontics/ Henry Schein Cares Foundation International Outreach Program has allowed over 30 endodontic residents and mentors to provide endodontic treatment to well deserving patients at Christian Dental Society's Helping Hands Clinic in Treasure Beach, Jamaica. The outreach program has served as an invaluable and life changing opportunity for volunteers and patients alike. Over the course of four, one-week trips in 2018, a total of 12 Foundation volunteers saved an astounding 90-plus teeth with root canal therapy. With the involvement of the Foundation at Helping Hands Clinic through support from corporate sponsors and generous donors, the community members in Treasure Beach and its surrounding areas were able to gain access to a level of care that was once unattainable. Through a continued commitment to service and an emphasis on educating the community, it is the Foundation's hope to help promote a sustainable improvement in the quality and standard of oral healthcare on a global level.

Stimulating Domestic Engagement


2018 marked the year the Foundation took its first steps towards its goal to develop a domestic outreach program. The first domestic pilot program launched in April 2018 at the Stephen Klein Wellness Center Project HOME thanks to the determination, hard work and unwavering passion from Drs. Frederic Barnett and Louis E. Rossman at Albert Einstein Medical Center. With this program now underway, the Foundation is actively supporting the opportunity for endodontic residents from Einstein Medical Center to provide endodontic care to the undeserved population within their local community. A similar program in partnership with Boston University and Geiger Gibson Health Center is set to launch in early 2019. The Foundation is eager to gain experience from these domestic pilot programs to inform the development and explore options for creating a funding opportunity for postgraduate residency programs to apply for funding to support proposed access to care activities within the United States.



Making a Holistic Impact

As it continues to develop and grow, the access to care initiative on both a global and domestic level is proving to serve as an invaluable experience for all parties involved. Not only are these programs creating opportunities for our volunteers to provide care to patients in underserved communities, it is bringing greater visibility and a heightened level of knowledge about the value of endodontic specialists and engaging young endodontic residents and general dentistry students with mentorship and the opportunity to gain hands-on experience from Board-certified specialists.




Treasure


